Zuzana Andreska is a doctoral student at Charles University in Prague, specializing in socio-legal studies and public policy. Her research focuses on the implementation of ombuds positions in higher education and their role in protecting rights within organizations, particularly in relation to equal treatment and occupational health and safety. She explores access to justice through alternative dispute resolution mechanisms as a complement or alternative to court proceedings. She also works as a junior researcher at the Centre for Gender and Science of the Institute of Sociology at the Czech Academy of Sciences. She contributed to the Horizon Europe project UniSAFE, which aimed to make universities and research organizations safer from gender-based violence.

The director of the Ecole Normale Supérieure, will kindly open the Final Conference. Jennifer Redmond - Associate Professor in Twentieth Century Irish History at the Department of History, Maynooth University, Ireland

Her research interests are in migration, the history of identity documentation, citizenship, gender and women's histories. She is the Chair of the HIDDEN COST Action (Identity documentation has come to feature in every part of modern life) which runs until October 2026. The main aim and objective of the Action is to create a better understanding of ID regimes by integrating personal narratives of those facing ID challenges (migrant or not) into scholarship and public discourses. It draws out the intersection of gendered, racialised and class issues in accessing citizenship documentation, especially in hotspot' countries at EU borders. Through this network, Jennifer has focused on providing opportunities for training and career development of ECR.

Martin Andler - Professor Emeritus UVSQ and President of a-Ulm

Dussane Room

Specialized in mathematics, history of science, philosophy of science and sociology. His main domains of research are Lie theory in mathematics, and in history the development of mathematics in France since 1870. A graduate of École normale supérieure in Paris, he obtained his PhD (doctorat d'État) from Université Paris-Diderot in 1983. He has held positions as a CNRS researcher, before joining Versailles-St-Quentin University. He has held visiting positions as professor at MIT, Rutgers, and as visitor at IAS-Princeton. He was vice-president of the Société mathématique de France (1997-1999) and the founding president of Animath, the main mathematics outreach organisation in France (1998-2017). His interest in European policy issues led him to be Vice-President of Euroscience (2012-2018). Since 2017, he has been the President of the Initiative for Science in Europe. of science


